Transport for Wales Consultation: This is part of the ongoing project with Usk Trail Action Group regarding the route from Little Mill to Usk on the old railway line. Suggested route on the survey covers the main road and using cycle paths on the pavement. Concerns over safety and narrowing of pavements into Little Mill where the cycle path would go onto roads. Cllr Howells suggested both an Active Travel Route and a Leisure route could be created by utilising the old railway line.

ACTION: Councillors advised to respond to this consultation.

RLDP: A Place Scrutiny was received from over 900 respondents, with over 4,000 responses. Most of the responses were objections or questions; officers have not recommended any changes

following these responses. The full report will be made available to County Councillors to vote on. The vote is for the full plan and not individual cases.

UTC response remains the same. Concerns were raised over the lack of time given to councillors to read through the responses before decisions are expected.

Usk Bridge: Cadw and Heritage discussions are ongoing. The initial response form Cadw suggested that just the main arches are listed, Heritage confirmed that it is also the walls on both sides that are listed. Heritage insisted that it is a problem for Highways. Following further discussions, Heritage have agreed to open a pre-planning app with Highways to look at the potential solutions.
