14.0 County Councillors participation

County Cllr M. Howells

MCC RLDP: Plan has now been submitted for independent examination and will be returned to councillors in summer 2026 for later adoption. Previously, the administration requested 4,000 homes across Monmouthshire, this is now reduced to just over 2,000. 50% will be affordable and net zero. 40 homes proposed for usk. Report is accessible on MCC website.

Town Council had previously voted against the proposal, County Councillor M. Howells voted for the proposal at MCC Planning review based on the resident survey results and his own views that Usk needs affordable housing for the younger generation.

Chainbridge: will be closed for 2-4 days towards end of November in preparation for the Spring refurbishment. Theis will take place on weekdays as not to disrupt the weekend business of the Chainbridge Inn and Craft Renaissance.

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Bus Passes: charges for 5 to 15yr olds are now £1.00 as 16 to 21yr olds.

Recycling: Wales could soon become Number 1 in the worlds for recycling; all it would take is for every person to recycle one banana skin a week.

15.5 Christmas Update

Meeting with UBSE will be this Wednesday, though previous meetings have been poorly attended. Businesses have been visited and most are able to take part I their own way. Businesses receive the minutes of the meetings with all information.

The list of stallholders has gone to MCC for approval.

The Three Salmons has kindly offered the car park and will be providing children's rides. There will be a double gazebo for performances of School choir, possibly the Rock Choir, Usk Brass Band and the Carol Singing with Rev Sally. Jane Hathaway stall will also be in the carpark.

Kindly, Mark Roberts has offered his shop for the church to run a craft event for children.

Road closure of Bridge St by Quantum is going ahead.

Church Street, Priory Street, Maryport Street and Old Market Street will be coned as an urban clearway; strictly no parking on either side, to allow free flow of traffic along the diversion through the town. There will be no traffic lights.

Christian Schmidt and Phaedra Cleary of Newport Buses have been contacted about the bus service and how this would be affected and would they appreciate UTC posting a notice in the bus stops to Caerleon that car services could be available. There has been no official response to this.

Police will be on duty on the day.

A letter will be sent to residents that will be affected.

There will be a charge of £40 a stall for those businesses that are not in Usk.

Russell from Willows has very kindly donated a real tree for the square, Festive lighting will provide the lights as part of their contract and Enerveo will install the lights.

National Grid: Matt Turner has written to inform us that there has been a 1.5million pounds investment to reinforce the Usk substation; a project that will strengthen the local power network for years to come. Discussions over where this is. The Mayor has been asked to comment for the press release.

U3A: letter relating to the increased charges to room hire and additional charge for kitchen use. The provision of hot drinks that needed to be carried. Swinging price increases has been unsustainable for members. They no longer feel valued clients and request that any future changes to Ts & Cs are properly negotiated to ensure objectives of both parties are realised. Treasurer – Keith Edwards.
